



- o All exhibitors perform the same skills in every group of a class.
- Only as many dogs should be in the ring as space safely allows. Classes may be divided into smaller groups.
- DDJ (Between dog and judge) rule: Brief blocking movements are allowed in order to enhance a smooth, accurate, and efficient presentation of the dog. Courtesy turns are allowed for the purposes of lining up the dog, calming or controlling the dog, and working the dog into proper gaiting speed.
- *In the case of a dog that is too shy or reserved for examination, the handler may personally show the required parts (teeth, ears, feet). If the judge can not place their hands on the dog for the individual exam and to check for mats and cleanliness, the handler is to receive a deduction.
- A dog may be asked to leave the ring if it is uncontrollable, aggressive to the judge or other participants and their dogs, or is
 distracting or disrupting with menacing behavior.
